

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COURSE 1: RESEARCH METHODOLOGY

1. What is historical research? Trying to find out what happened in the past and why it happened the way it did – Facts – causation in history – New facts or new interpretation or both.
2. Identifying a problem.
3. Considering what has been done in the subject and what remains to be done.
4. Thesis Engineering – Collection of material – both secondary and primary. The index card.
5. Nature of sources – variations according to the subject.
6. Analysis of data – impressionistic and systematic analyses – quantitative techniques – computer-aided analyses.
7. Synthesis of data.
8. Presentation – chapterization – paragraphing – referencing and foot- or end-noting – charts, maps and other aids – bibliography.
